**HARRIS COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT TO RELEASE  
FLOOD HAZARD RECOVERY DATA FOR BARKER RESERVOIR WATERSHED**

*Data Includes Mason Creek and Cane Island Branch*

- WHAT:**
- The Harris County Flood Control District will release Flood Hazard Recovery Data via the Tropical Storm Allison Recovery Web site ([www.tsarp.org](http://www.tsarp.org)) for the Barker Reservoir watershed, including Mason Creek and Cane Island Branch.
  - The Data represents the 1% and 0.2% floodplains (100- and 500-year) and floodways for these watersheds using the latest engineering methods and technology.
  - The Data has been developed by the District and the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and will be used to produce new Digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps for communities in Harris County.
  - The Data will not be used for flood insurance rate purposes.

**WHEN:** Flood Hazard Recovery Data for these watersheds will be available on the Internet at approximately 9 a.m. on Monday, June 21<sup>st</sup>.

- THE DATA:**
- The Flood Hazard Recovery Data for Little Cypress Creek watershed, including Mason Creek and Cane Island Branch, will be available on a CD and can be requested by members of the media beginning June 21<sup>st</sup> at 9 a.m.
  - Spokespersons from the Harris County Flood Control District will be available for interviews by appointment on June 21<sup>st</sup>.
  - The Harris County Flood Control District previously released Flood Hazard Recovery Data for Brays, Buffalo, Carpenters, Hunting, Jackson, Little Cypress Creek, Luce, San Jacinto (north of 1-10), Sims, Spring Gully/Goose Creek, Spring Creek, and Willow Creek watersheds.
