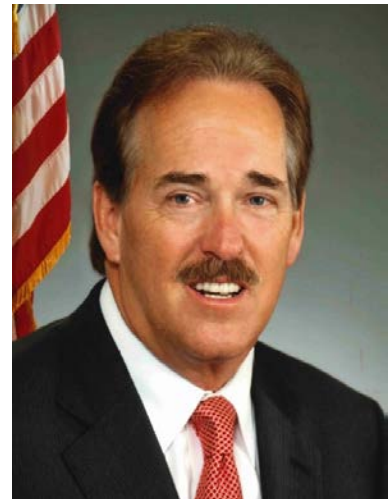
## **APPOINTMENT OF NEW 9-1-1 BOARD MEMBER**
